

Boil Water Notice for Shamrock Municipal Water System
April 20, 2026

All Shamrock municipal water customers; the pressure in the water distribution system may have fallen below 20 PSI.

Due to a break in the water transmission supply piping, the pressure within the water distribution system has dropped below 20 PSI. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has required the Shamrock Municipal Water system PWS #2420001 to notify all customers to boil their water prior to consumption (e.g. washing hands/face, brushing teeth, drinking, etc.). Children, seniors, and persons with weakened immune systems are particularly vulnerable to harmful bacteria, and all customers should follow these directions.

To ensure destruction of all harmful bacteria and other microbes, water for drinking, cooking and ice making should be boiled and cooled prior to use for drinking water or human consumption purposes. The water should be brought to a vigorous rolling boil and then boiled for two minutes.

In lieu of boiling, individuals may purchase bottled water or obtain water from some other suitable source for drinking water or human consumption purposes.

Once the boil water notice is no longer in effect, the public water system will issue a notice to customers that the water is safe for human consumption purposes and rescind the boil water notice in a manner similar to this notice.

Please share this information with all other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
